LAPS MEMBERSHIP CLASSES:

ASSOCIATE MEMBER: (\$15 per year) Associate Members are entitled to vote in the Board of Directors' elections, be nominated to the Board of Directors, and be appointed to a committee.

SENIOR MEMBER: (\$10 per year) Senior Members receive the same benefits as Associate Members, but this class is reserved for those who are 60 years and older.

ANGEL MEMBER: (\$50 per year) Angel Members receive the same benefits as Associate Members, a 'LAPS Angel' pin and certain privileges at events, to be announced for each event, if eligible. Those that are eligible for Associate Member or Senior Member are eligible for this class.

YOUTH MEMBER: (\$5 per year) Youth Members are non-voting members under the age of 16.

FAREWELLS: March 2017 - Present

Since our last newsletter, we've had to say "Godspeed" to several of our residents.

Rest in peace, dear kitties; you were loved and will be missed.



Margo When Margo was rescued from the outdoors by a good Samaritan, she was already in poor condition. She was diagnosed with heartworm and hyperthyroid as well as being dehydrated and severely underweight. Despite our best efforts, and those of her foster mom, Margo passed away two weeks after her arrival. We take comfort in knowing Margo felt loved during her final hours. Margo was estimated to be around 10 years old.



Violet came to LAPS after her former owner could no longer care for her. She was a quiet and unassuming cat who lived her life in the Senior Cat Room. She kept to herself but would sit on your lap for as long as you would let her and was known to give "love" bites when being petted. Sadly, Violet passed away unexpectedly from a bile duct obstruction. She was approximately 11 years old.



Albus came to LAPS after his elderly owner passed away. Sadly he was only with us for three months when he was discovered deceased after being seen playing an hour earlier. A necropsy revealed cause of death as cardiac abnormality which appeared to be from a lesion due to a previous infection to the heart muscle causing arrhythmia. Albus was only two years old.



Cheddar was a handsome boy who spent half his life as a LAPS resident. Cheddar was diagnosed with lymphoma which was treated with medication until he was no longer enjoying a quality of life. Cheddar was assisted across the Rainbow Bridge with Mary & Maureen by his side. Cheddar was approximately 15 years old.



Silver came to LAPS as a stray who tested positive for FIV. He was known for his outgoing personality and his limp, which was due to an untreated injury before he came to us. Silver was diagnosed with lymphoma and was treated until he was no longer enjoying a quality of life. He was assisted across the Rainbow Bridge with Maureen and Cyndi by his side. Silver was approximately 12 years old.



Whatchacallit came to LAPS after his owner decided to move and not take him. Unfortunately for Whatchacallit, he was not a cat who adapted well to shelter life and he became so sick that he almost lost his life. After a weeklong stay at the vet hospital, Whatchacallit was taken into a foster home. It was touch and go for three months, but he finally recovered. Whatchacallit thrived in his foster home for almost six years until he needed to be assisted across The Rainbow Bridge due to kidney disease. Whatchacallit was approximately 17 years old.

Just a reminder when you are adopting a cat, to take the time to meet the scared ones, the shy ones, the ones that don't stick out to you. The ones that hide under their beds or blankets, or behind the litter box. The ones that hiss, the ones that cower at your touch. The ones with the boring colors or missing limbs. The older ones. The slightly feral ones. The ones who seem beyond repair, and the ones who seem to have given up. Because they are not, and they haven't. They just need YOU. And you may just really need them too.

10 Reasons Senior Cats Rule

- When senior cats are adopted, they seem to understand that they've been rescued, and are all the more thankful for it.
- A senior cat's personality has already developed, so you'll know if he or she is a good fit for your family.
- ❖ You can teach an old cat new tricks: Senior cats have the attention span and impulse control that makes them easier to train than their youthful counterparts.
- A senior cat may very well already know basic household etiquette (like not attacking your feet at night) anyway!
- In particular, senior cats are often already litter trained and are less likely to "forget" where the box is.
- A senior cat won't grow any larger, so you'll know exactly how much cat you're getting.
- Senior cats are often content to just relax in your company, unlike younger cats, who may get into mischief because they're bored.
- Speaking of relaxing, senior cats make great napping buddies.
- Senior cats often know that scratching posts (not furniture) are for scratching and toys (not hands or feet) are for biting.
- Senior cats are some of the hardest to find homes for so when you adopt a senior cat, you're truly saving a life.
