## LAPS NEW T-SHIRT DESIGN

LAPS has a new T-shirt design: the yin yang symbol depicted by cats. Yin yang is the ancient symbol of harmony and reminds us that life is a balancing act and most fulfilling when we learn to embrace its dualities: the ups & downs; the good times & bad; the joys & challenges. The world is always in motion; keep your balance. Work enough to support your lifestyle but remember to invest your time in what is important to you. Don't lose sight of why you are working so hard. Know your priorities; know yourself.

The T-shirts come in 3 colors (mint green, sky blue, sport gray) and sizes Small through 3X. T-shirts are Gildan heavy cotton (adult, crew neck, 5.3 oz cotton). The mint green and sky blue are 100% cotton, the sport gray is 90% cotton/10% polyester.

In an effort to keep our inventory of T-shirts in line with our supporters' needs, we are working with our printer to produce smaller batches of the T-shirts in sizes specifically requested by our supporters. Therefore, we will be taking orders and submitting on a monthly basis (more often, if demand warrants). Please allow 4-6 weeks to receive your T-shirt. You can choose a delivery option at check out with the choices being either picking up your order at the shelter (for no charge; we will schedule a pick up day/time) or having the item mailed to you via First Class Mail (postage will be calculated at check-out).

# WHEN THERE IS NO OTHER CHOICE

magine being diagnosed with terminal cancer. Imagine becoming too ill to take care of your cats. Imagine having to make one of the most difficult decisions in your life – giving up your fur babies because you can no longer care for them.

Now imagine you can find no one to take your cats — no friends, no family, not even a shelter. This is a frequent occurrence, no matter the reason behind the need to rehome a cat. Imagine the stress of knowing that you

are dying and not knowing what will happen to your cats. One has to wonder what there is left to fight for.....

Sadly, this is a reality for Lynda, the former owner of Tickle, Tackle, Toesy, and Itty Bitty Kitty. Lynda is losing her battle with cancer and was forced to make one of the most difficult decisions in her life when terminal cancer stole her ability to take care of

her feline family. LAPS was contacted on more than one occasion in regard to these 4 cats; however, a few months earlier, we had taken in 5 cats: Bailey, Cooper, Gracie, Rudy, and Sadie, whose 54-year old owner had already lost her battle with cancer.

Initially, we said that we could not help Lynda. Then, out of desperation, LAPS received one final plea to help Lynda. This person knew LAPS is not your average shelter. Cats are not kept in small cages indefinitely. Cats are not euthanized for space. Cats are not sent to other shelters after a period of time when they have no adoption interest. LAPS volunteers take care of the feline residents as if they were their own and do so until they are adopted or until they reach the end of their life due to terminal illness or age.

LAPS is a limited-intake facility. This means we have to make certain we can financially take care of the cats we accept into our facility. This also means we have to turn cats away. It is not

something we like to do. In fact, it breaks our hearts. But we must be responsible to the cats that already reside at LAPS and depend on us. LAPS receives no state or federal funding. All of our expenses are funded by the generosity of our supporters through adoption fees, sponsors, donations, membership

dues, fundraising events, etc.

LAPS realized that Lynda's case was special. Lynda wasn't giving up her cats due to allergies, behavioral issues, moving, or because they had become inconvenient. Lynda didn't want to give up her fur babies - terminal cancer was giving her no other choice. So, even though space was limited, LAPS shuffled a few of our current resident kitties to different rooms in order to give Lynda the peace of mind that her babies would be safe and well cared for.

Tickle, Tackle, Toesy, and Itty Bitty Kitty will all receive dentals then be placed available for adoption. Bailey, Cooper, Gracie, Rudy, and Sadie are already fully vetted and available for adoption. Any of these 9 fur babies will certainly make a great addition to your family!

# Rainbow Bridges



came to LAPS after his owner passed away. Whitey was quite talkative and loved to eat. He always let the volunteers know he was hungry, even if he had just been fed five minutes prior! Whitey developed heart, liver, and bladder issues which ended up being too much for his body to handle and was assisted across The Rainbow Bridge. He was approximately 14 years old.

was rescued from the streets and surrendered to LAPS when he was approximately 7 years of age. He tested positive for FIV so he resided in the same room with other FIV positive cats. Cassidy was distrustful of humans in the beginning, but eventually learned that his caretakers at LAPS were good for regular meals at the very least. He became a scrappy old guy who was beloved and protected by his feline roommates as well as earning spots in the hearts of many of our volunteers. Cassidy developed heart and kidney disease and was assisted across the Rainbow Bridge. He was approximately 14 years old.



was returned to LAPS in 2013 after her adopter passed away. Shortly afterward, she became ill and was diagnosed with diabetes. Since diabetic kitties need insulin injections every 12 hours and need a strict diet regimen, she went off to foster care. She spent 5 years with Kerri, her devoted foster mom, growling at her housemates and watching squirrels out the sunporch windows. She was a feisty girl who had a tendency to bite first and ask questions later. Earlier this year, a lump was discovered on her belly; it turned out to be cancer. In September, she had had quite enough poking and prodding and was assisted across the bridge. Kahlua was approximately 15 years old.

#### LAPS MEMBERSHIP CLASSES:

**ASSOCIATE MEMBER (\$15 per year):** Associate Members are entitled to vote in the Board of Directors' elections, be nominated to the Board of Directors, and be appointed to a committee.

**SENIOR MEMBER (\$10 per year):** Senior Members receive the same benefits as Associate Members, but this class is reserved for those who are 60 years and older.

**ANGEL MEMBER (\$50 per year):** Angel Members receive the same benefits as Associate Members, a 'LAPS Angel' pin and certain privileges at events, to be announced for each event, if eligible. Those that are eligible for Associate Member or Senior Member are eliqible for this class.

YOUTH MEMBER (\$5 per year): Youth Members are non-voting members under the age of 16.


