

### LAPS MEMBERSHIP CLASSES:

**ASSOCIATE MEMBER (\$15 per year):** Associate Members are entitled to vote in the Board of Directors' elections, be nominated to the Board of Directors, and be appointed to a committee.

SENIOR MEMBER (\$10 per year): Senior Members receive the same benefits as Associate Members, but this class is reserved for those who are 60 years and older.

ANGEL MEMBER (\$50 per year): Angel Members receive the same benefits as Associate Members, a 'LAPS Angel' pin and certain privileges at events, to be announced for each event, if eligible. Those that are eligible for Associate Member or Senior Member are eligible for this class.

**YOUTH MEMBER (\$5 per year):** Youth Members are non-voting members under the age of 16.

# Christmas Cash Raffle





was surrendered after her people moved. She lived at LAPS for 7 years, begging treats and acting the diva. Atsuko developed kidney disease and was assisted across The Rainbow Bridge when she could no longer fight it. She was approximately 12 years old.



Beat Cub was returned to LAPS after his owners moved. He lived at LAPS for about 5 years, capturing our hearts with his sweetness. Bear Cub developed kidney disease on top of some ongoing heart issues and was assisted across The Rainbow Bridge when his fight became too difficult. He was 9 years old and is affectionately remembered for his macaroni toes and his fondness for water fountains.



Buddy came to LAPS with urinary tract issues after his owners had tried every treatment recommended to them by their vet. Buddy was a big boy who had trouble keeping himself clean and, while he didn't appreciate our attempts to help with that, it did seem as though his urinary tract issues were alleviated under our care. Buddy passed away unexpectedly during the night, and an autopsy revealed undiagnosed kidney disease and a cardiac event, more than likely due to kidney disease and his weight. Buddy was 8.5 years old.



came to LAPS after being rescued from a colony. They were friendly cats who should have been pets instead of having to live outdoors. Both suffered from upper respiratory problems which went untreated while in the colony, causing irreversible damage to their nasal cavities. These two cats were strongly bonded and shared a room at LAPS. Over the years that they lived at LAPS, we tried every treatment and medication recommended by our vets, giving them small stretches of relief, but never a cure. In March, Sadie stopped eating and began to struggle to breathe. Sadie was assisted across The Rainbow Bridge at age 15. Abe grieved his longtime friend, and while all our volunteers went to great lengths to show him extra love and attention, he was having a difficult time. Three weeks after Sadie got her angel wings, Abe, who was 11 years old, began struggling to breathe and had to be assisted across The Rainbow Bridge. We like to believe Sadie and Abe are together once again and now they can breathe freely!



lived almost her entire life at LAPS after she was rescued from a colony as a kitten. In her later years, Tonya developed thyroid issues which were easily treated with daily medication. While medicating and feeding her, we noticed that Tonya's eyes were very dilated which can be a sign of high blood pressure in cats. Tonya was at the vet for testing and treatment, when she, sadly, suffered a heart attack and passed on her own. She was approximately 15 years old.



was admitted to LAPS after we found out she was going to be euthanized because she had Cerebellar Hypoplasia. Cerebellar Hypoplasia is a neurological condition which occurs when parts of the cerebellum are not completely developed. CH is a prenatal condition which affects fine motor skills, balance, and coordination. Cats with CH learn to adapt, often with an adorable wobbly walk, and since CH doesn't get worse, it certainly does not warrant euthanasia. Zeva lived at LAPS for 4 years until we discovered she had a tumor in her heart which restricted blood flow and caused labored breathing. Zeva was assisted across The Rainbow Bridge. She was approximately 7 years old.
